Health & Safety

Vaccinations are not required for Symposium attendees but are strongly encouraged. Based on public health conditions at the time of the event, the Ohio Osteopathic Symposium reserves the right to require health and safety measures, including but not limited to negative COVID-19 testing and/or mandatory mask-wearing.

Authority of Show Management

The Ohio Osteopathic Foundation retains full authority to interpret, amend, and enforce all rules, regulations, and policies governing the Symposium. All decisions made by OOF are final. Any amendments to agreements related to the Symposium must be made in writing and signed by all parties to be binding. OOF reserves the right to recover reasonable attorney fees and costs incurred in enforcing these policies or related agreements.

Photography, Recording & Media Use

Attendees may be photographed, recorded, or filmed during the Symposium. By attending, participants grant OOS and its partners, the OU-HCOM, OOA, and OOF permission to use such images and recordings for educational, marketing, and promotional purposes. Recording, photographing, or distributing Symposium content without prior authorization from OOF is strictly prohibited.

Data Privacy

The OOS values and respects the privacy of all Symposium participants. Personal information collected during registration and participation is used solely for event-related purposes, including communication, session access, and exhibitor or sponsor engagement when consent is provided. OOS and its partners do not sell attendee data to third parties. Information is shared only with trusted partners supporting Symposium operations and in compliance with applicable data protection laws.

Cancellation, Refund & Substitution Policy

Registration Cancellations

- All cancellation requests must be submitted in writing to symposium@ohiodo.org by **11:59 PM ET on March 27, 2026**.
- Cancellations received by this deadline are eligible for:
 - A full refund, less a \$50 administrative fee, **or**
 - Transfer to the On-Demand attendance option at no additional charge.
- Cancellations received on or after March 28, 2026, are non-refundable and will be converted to the On-Demand option.
- No-shows are non-refundable.
- Refunds, when applicable, will be processed within 15 business days.

Substitutions

- Registrations may be transferred to another individual from the same organization at no additional charge.

- All substitution requests must be submitted in writing to symposium@ohiodo.org.
- Substitutions cannot be accepted after **March 27, 2026**.

Special Circumstances
