The Ohio Psychiatric Physicians Association (OPPA) and Ohio Psychiatric Physicians Foundation (OPPF) invite all OPPA members, resident/fellows and medical students to participate by submitting an abstract for consideration to display a poster during the upcoming Annual Psychiatric Update to be held on April 18-19, 2026. The Poster Display is designed to encourage participation in the scientific method and to highlight original contributions to the field of psychiatry. There will be no judging of posters in advance and there will be no awarding of prizes. The only judging that will take place is of the abstracts. **SEE FAQs for more information**.

Submission Requirements for Abstracts

Submission of abstracts will be in three parts:





- 2. All authors identified on the intent to submit abstract form must complete a "Disclosure of Financial Interests" form prior to submission of the abstract. The primary contact is responsible for ensuring that all disclosures have been submitted to OPPF - it is the responsibility of the primary contact to follow-up with authors who have not submitted their disclosures.
- 3. Once all disclosures have been received from all authors, OPPA staff will send a link to the "Abstract for Poster Display" form.

IMPORTANT: Incomplete entries and late entries will not be accepted. There will be no exceptions.

Criteria for Acceptance and Judging of Abstracts

All abstracts will be scored base points on the type of submission as follows:



- Primary author (medical student, resident/ fellow) = 10 points
- Original research = 10 points
- Case Reports = 5 points
- Quality Improvement/Quality Excellence = 7.5 points
- Literature Review = 0 points

Additional points

(1 = marginal; 2 = acceptable; 3 = aboveaverage; 4 = excellent) will be given for the following criteria:

- Originality of work
- Contribution to advancing psychiatric knowledge
- · Quality of writing



On-site Posters vs. Virtual Display Only on Website

On-site Poster

Based the scoring criteria above, the TOP 15 highest scoring abstracts will be accepted as posters for display on-site during OPPA's Annual Psychiatric Update (as well as a .pdf of poster uploaded to OPPA's website.

Virtual Display Only of .PDFs

For the remaining abstracts (not ranking in the top 15, the primary contact will be offered the opportunity to prepare a .pdf format only for virtual display on OPPA's website.

OPPF/OPPA Poster Display Abstracts FAQs

The Ohio Psychiatric Physicians Association (OPPA) and Ohio Psychiatric Physicians Foundation (OPPF) invite all OPPA members (including resident/fellows and medical students) to participate by submitting an abstract for consideration to display a poster during the upcoming Annual Psychiatric Update to be held on April 18-19, 2026. This FAQ was developed to address questions related to the Poster Abstract Guidelines document.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Q1. What is the "Poster Display"?

The event is referred to as the Poster Display to clarify that no oral presentations are required. Participants submit an abstract and, if accepted, prepare and display a poster summarizing their research or scholarly work.

Q2. Who is eligible to participate?

OPPA members (including General Members, Resident-Fellow Members, and Medical Student Members) are invited to participate.

Q3. Is there any oral or live presentation component?

No, the poster display does not include an oral presentation. Poster participants are required to stand next to their poster for a minimum of one break to be available for any questions from attendees.

Q4. Will posters be judged or awarded prizes?

No. Posters will not be judged and no prizes will be awarded. Only abstracts are reviewed and scored for acceptance.

PURPOSE AND GOALS

Q5. What is the purpose of the Poster Display?

The poster display provides an opportunity for medical students, residents, fellows and general members to share research, case reports, or scholarly work in psychiatry. It encourages engagement with the scientific process and showcases original contributions to the field.

PURPOSE AND GOALS

Q6. How do I submit an abstract?

Abstract submission occurs in three stages:

- Intent to Submit an Abstract Form includes the title and contact information for all authors.
- Disclosure of Financial Interests Form must be completed by all authors identified on the Intent to Submit an Abstract Form prior to submission of the abstract.
- Abstract for Poster Display Form OPPF will provide the link to this form once all disclosures have been received.

Q7. Who is responsible for ensuring all disclosures are submitted?

The primary contact listed on the Intent to Submit an Abstract form is responsible for confirming that every author has submitted their disclosure.

Q8. What happens if a disclosure form or abstract is incomplete?

Incomplete submissions—including missing or unsigned disclosures—will not be accepted.

Q9. Can I submit my abstract after the deadline?

No. Late entries will not be accepted under any circumstances. There are no exceptions.

REVIEW AND ACCEPTANCE

Q10. How are abstracts judged?

Abstracts are scored based on the type of submission and the quality of the content.

- Base points:
 - Learner (medical student, resident, or fellow): 10 points
 - o Original research: 10 points
 - Quality Improvement/Quality Excellence: 7.5 points
 - Case report: 5 points
 - Literature review: 0 points
- Additional points (1 = marginal, 2= acceptable, 3= above average, 4= excellent) will be given for the following criteria:
 - Originality of the work
 - Contribution to advancing psychiatric knowledge
 - Quality of writing

Q11. How many posters will be accepted for display?

The primary contact for the top 15 highest-scoring abstracts will be invited to create a poster for onsite display and will also appear online as a .pdf. The primary contacts of the remaining abstracts (if accepted) will be invited to create a .pdf poster for virtual display only on the OPPA/OPPF website.

Q12. Will I be notified if my abstract is accepted?

Yes. The primary contact will receive notification 45 days before the meeting regarding acceptance and display format (onsite or virtual only).

TIMELINE AND DEADLINES

Q13. What are the key deadlines for 2026?

- Abstract submission deadline: February 18, 2026
- Notification of acceptance: March 4, 2026
- Deadline for .pdf poster submission: April 3, 2026

Q14. What if I submit my .pdf poster after April 3?

Late .pdfs will not be displayed before the meeting.

DISPLAY AND FORMAT

Q15. What format should my poster be in?

Posters for virtual or onsite display must be submitted as a .pdf file. Specific formatting instructions will be provided upon acceptance. All .pdfs will be posted on the website AFTER the meeting date.
